Further encouragement comes from the prophet Hosea. In speaking to His backsliding people, God calls them to return to serving Him with these tender words in Hosea 14:4:

God has not been locked-down nor has He abandoned us, so let's determine to "seek first His kingdom and His righteousness" (Matthew 6:33) with renewed spiritual vigour as we come out of lock-down restrictions knowing that "labour in the Lord is not in vain" (1Corinthians 15:58).
