In Luke 12:13-21, Jesus warns some squabbling brothers fighting over receiving the inheritance of their presumably recently deceased father.

'Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions.'

How little things have changed! We gain more possessions and wealth in the hope we may have 'life.' Jesus tells a pointed story, where a rich farmer has a bumper harvest, and think's he has it made.

'And I'll say to myself, "You have plenty of grain laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry."

But these words reverberate:

"But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?'

"This is how it will be with whoever stores up things for themselves but is not rich toward God."

Are you prepared for the biggest life-altering event? Have you invested wisely in a sure hope, in reconciling with God through Christ, and living for him? Or is your greatest hope in life something which will simply be given to someone else?


