"I don't want to be a burden."

In our culture, we are often painted idealistic narratives of freedom and independence. We are told to be free from our community to pursue our dreams, or dream of the community coming around us to celebrate our dreams.

But we also have our faults, failings, and challenges. We also want to be close to people. Yet bringing these realities together is risky. Risky we might get rejected if people really know us, or if our hopes fail. So we can find it easier to disengage from others.

Data from Barna research in the US says that adults are twice as likely to say they are lonely than a decade ago. One in 5 says they are lonely. Is this because of our independence?

Galatians 6:2 pushes the call for Christians to love each other, even into working through the messiness of imperfect people working to live of Christlike lives and challenging relationships.

Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.

Also, Colossians 3:13:

Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you.

Helping one another to keep in step with the Spirit involves grace, a willingness to help, and a willingness to be helped. It doesn't need to be known or by all, perhaps just a few you know.

News from GAFCON

A new Diocese of the Southern Cross has now been established, with Bishop Glenn Davies taking up the responsibilities as Bishop of the new Diocese.

Please see below for the statement issued by Archbishop Kanishka Raffel:

The Diocese of Sydney is an integral part of the Anglican Church of Australia and we have no intention of leaving.

Parishes, schools and organisations in the Diocese of Sydney are not affected by this development and there will be no change to our structures. We are committed to the reform of the Anglican Church of Australia from within our existing ecclesial structures, including the General Synod.

The Diocese of the Southern Cross has been established for those elsewhere who have left their diocese because they cannot in good conscience accept the authority of those who have departed from the teaching of Christ.

It is a sadness that this new Diocese has become necessary, but I extend the hand of fellowship to the Diocese of the Southern Cross and may God bless Bishop Davies and his work.


