

# 10 Practices to Kill Pride

I recently read a short essay by Gavin Ortland called '10 Practices to Kill Pride'. One of Ortland's ideas to help us cultivate humility is practising gratitude. Imagine, he writes, that you've been invited to a dinner party of your favourite celebrities and you get to spend all evening in the company of the people you greatly admire. Would you catch yourself thinking: Who am I that I get to be here and talk to all these people?

Ortland argues that true humility allows us to have that experience all the time. Because it's not just celebrities that we should feel privileged to be around, but every image bearer of God. Every person we encounter, every sacred corner of this world that we inhabit bears the stamp of our Creator. And so we can walk into any situation and freely wonder at the blessings received: 'Who am I, that I get to be here? Why am I so blessed?'

We can easily see the joy that could be ours if we cultivated this kind of outlook. And yet, how difficult to practice it! In my grumbling about the school car park, for example, am I able to step back and ask: Who am I, that I get to be here? Who am I, that I should be given beautiful children, a place of learning full of caring teachers to take them to each day and a car to transport them?

I can tell you this kind of thinking is not going to come naturally in my case. Pray that we can be a thankful and humble church who reap a harvest of joy as we practise gratitude for all the Father's good gifts.
