

Training the future

As most of you know, I recently got a new puppy, Kenobi. We have been attending puppy preschool for the last couple of weeks, and he will graduate soon. As I have been thinking about training I was reminded about the passage Proverbs 22:6:

Start children off on the way they should go,

and even when they are old they will not turn from it.

Throughout Scripture, God is pretty clear about the responsibility He places in the hands of parents. None is more clear than Deuteronomy 6:6-7: "

These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up.."

Those who are parents have a responsibility to teach children what matters to God. It doesn't mean forcing them into a certain set of beliefs or rituals; rather, it means demonstrating a real faith – one that puts the focus on loving God and loving others. However, I believe that we all have this responsibility as the church and family of God. Children are going to learn about the world around them and their role in it. If they don't learn from us, they will learn from someone else. Children are sponges - they soak up everything, both good and bad.

So, how are you training the future generation? Do you imitate and walk in love as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us? Children often imitate what they see. They learn how to act by seeing how we act. They'll only know how to love by seeing how we love. If they are imitating us, and we are imitating God, then the children in our church will grow up knowing what it means to follow Christ.
