

Safety in what?

Australia is a very safe country. Perhaps today, it is safer than it ever has been. Yet no matter how protected we are, there is a consistent and overriding call for things to be more harm free. Safety is good, but life cannot be made completely risk-free, and attempts to do so can have unhelpful consequences.

When it comes to children, we acknowledge that some risk is necessary for growth and development. Where once playgrounds were being designed with safety as the overriding concern, adventure play is now replacing bland and boring designs with more interesting and developmentally appropriate objects.

Similarly, when it raising children as disciples of Jesus, it is good for parents can be careful with the major influences in a child's life. But no parent is omniscient or omnipotent over a child's external environment or internal thoughts. Nor should they be. Sometimes Christians err in this regard by considering themselves the shield of 'safety' in protecting their children from the influences of the world. However, upon adulthood (or earlier) the child has felt so constrained they long to be free of the suffocating form of Christianity they experienced, or are so unprepared for the world outside the Christian bubble that they are overwhelmed.

Proverbs 14:26-27 gives us wisdom on this point. Christian parents need to teach that the Lord is our absolute shield in life, and in him we have safety and security. In fearing him is a fountain of knowledge for how to live well and turn away from evil. In him and through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we even have safety and restoration through suffering and death. The greatest safety which can be given is knowledge of how to know and fear the Lord God.

Whoever fears the LORD has a secure fortress, and for their children it will be a refuge.

The fear of the LORD is a fountain of life,

turning a person from the snares of death. (Proverbs 14:26-27)
