



A New Start: Meeting with God's family

A sixth part of living as a Christian is meeting together as the church.

And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching. (Hebrews 10:24-25)

When we meet together as a church, it is not just to receive (teaching, friendship, morning tea!), but it also is a time where we give. When John Donne wrote that 'no man is an island' it was in reference to the interconnectedness of all people. For a Christian, God does not save us through Christ to be 'islands,' but part of a connected group of believers.

In meeting together, we gain something more than when it's just me and my Bible. We gain a mutual encouragement which cannot be gained by downloading sermons, and remote connection. We learn about love and good deeds, but we also stir one another up to live them out! Our presence, our interactions and our prayers keep us going in Christ, until his return. Frequently meeting together with other Christians supercharges our life as Christians.

We all know the power of good and bad habits, and gathering together is one of the best, in the light of Christ's return. That day, of course, is one of judgement or salvation depending on whether we trust in Christ and continue with him until then. So with that in mind, let's make it our habit to meet together as a congregation, and encourage each other to keep living for Jesus.
