

2 Corinthians Memory Verse Odyssey

2 Corinthians is my favourite book of the Bible. The message of finding strength in weakness is particularly precious to me. But also, I feel that it's the New Testament letter where we see Paul at both his most vulnerable and most resilient. His heart is well and truly on his sleeve and the depth of his feeling for Christ and his church is laid out for all to see.

In Kids Church this term, we will be embarking on a 2 Corinthians memory verse odyssey. Each week, we'll be looking at stand-out verses from the passage and working on ways to put them to memory. There are two main ways we'll tackle this:

- Memory verse cards with the entire verse on one side and a prompt on the other. The prompt is simply the first letter of each word in the verse arranged in a continuous string to aid recall.
- A playlist of songs for each of the verses

I was brought up in a church that loved the old Scripture in Song books. There's no denying a certain 80's dagginess about those songs, but there's also no denying the effectiveness of singing to aid memorisation. 30-something years on and I couldn't unlearn those verses if I tried!

To make the playlist for this term, I trawled through YouTube and Spotify to find songs for the appropriate verses. There are certainly degrees of musicality and professionalism in the recordings, but I was encouraged by just how many other believers there are out there seeking to get God's word from 2 Corinthians into their minds and hearts.

The memory verse cards will be available for everyone, not just the kids! Some verses have short versions (marked in bold) and extended versions. Help yourself to a memorisation card from the foyer table. Each week, more cards will appear. Buddy up and commit to the challenge with a partner. I'm still considering whether I will drag volunteers to the lectern each week and have a Verse-Off. Adults vs kids?!

But mostly I'm hoping that, if it isn't already, 2 Corinthians might become one of your favourites, too.
