

Christians: Saints, sufferers and sinners

When discipling adults and children to follow Jesus, it can be a challenge to keep a rounded idea of what a Christian is like – be it of ourselves, or in relating to others in the church. One helpful way to approach this is to remember, and hold in balance, that Christians are saints, sufferers and sinners (as noted by author Michael Emlet).

Saints – every Christian is considered holy and righteous before God, through Jesus Christ. By trusting in Jesus as Lord and God, they have been restored to God and are cleared of the record of their sins. Unlike what the Roman Catholic church teaches, every Christian is a saint, a holy one, through faith in Jesus Christ. This is even if they are acting in ways that God has called them to change from. For instance, see 1 Corinthians 1:2. It a disastrous church yet Paul calls them 'sanctified' and 'holy people/saints.'

Sufferers – in this lifetime, being a Christian does not prevent suffering. We will still age, decay, and are prone to accidents, mental health struggles and various conditions. We have hope through it all, trusting in God's restored creation to come, but nevertheless life can be very hard. Similarly, we may be excluded or persecuted for being a Christian. In this we follow Jesus' example, who suffered even as he trusted his Father. Some Christians are even martyred as witnesses for their faith.

Sinners – upon becoming a Christian, a person may experience a dramatic change in behaviour and speech, but they will still sin in various ways. It can be a surprise when some people who initially seems so 'saintly' are also sinners. But Jesus is the only truly righteous one, and even the best of people needs his salvation. Yet a Christian is a forgiven sinner in identity and status before God, who also is being transformed in their actions and words over time. The process of speaking up about sin, forgiving and bearing with one another matures us in practicing love and becoming more like Jesus.


