

Why SRE Matters to All of Us

In Newman I was asked questions about Sydney Diocese that initially surprised me. They all came from visitors; one a Reformed Church Perth couple the others from the son of the first Anglican Rector in Newman (C 1969), who was visiting with his mother and brother.

The questions, on different Sundays, followed the same line: Why has Sydney remained so strong and committed to the Gospel truth in the face of many others wavering and becoming liberal? The following reasons were suggested:

- Commitment to the inerrant Word of God as the ultimate authority.
- Support of Moore College against threats to alter its focus in training women and men for ministry.
- Overall leadership (Archbishops, Synods, and others)
- SRE in the schools.

Why SRE? Since the 1880s, ministry in the Public Schools has been strongly supported. Initially, it reached children from Church families, but over time this has changed, now it represents prime Evangelism reaching more unreached young people weekly than most parishes do via all other ministries. Many students hear the Gospel for the very first time and, some have been saved. Over the years a good few have entered full-time ministry. Is it any wonder SRE opposition remains so active? Darkness will always oppose the "Light of the World," but we have the victory in Him while the battles go on.

A final suggestion was that the questioners read: "The Foundations of Public Prosperity Evangelical Christians in Australian History 1740-1914" by Stuart Piggin and Robert Linder. Not a tome for everyone, but well worth the effort especially if you enjoy history. Romans 8:26-28 says it all. Please keep praying for SRE and support this key ministry.




