

Why creeds?

If the Bible is sufficient for salvation and godly living (2 Tim. 3:14-17), we might ask: What is the purpose of creeds and confessions? Here are a few reasons, drawn from Carl Trueman's book *Crisis of Confidence*:

1. Better public than private

When asked about what the Bible teaches, no one proceeds to read aloud Genesis 1:1-Revelation 22:21. Rather, we all have summaries of the Bible's teaching in our minds. Making these explicit clarifies our beliefs for communication and makes critique possible. A private creed is just as, or perhaps more, susceptible to being placed over scripture than under it, compared to a public one. Having public statements give further transparency for governance, leadership and teaching ministries.

2. Not starting from scratch

Some aspects of the Scriptures and the knowledge of God are straightforward and understood easily, but others involve more thorough consideration. Creeds bring clarity and concision on matters such as the gospel, the incarnation, and the Trinity, so that they can be established across the church and taught to newcomers. It would be painful if one had to justify the details of the Trinity from scratch each week.

3. Doctrinal summary

While many things can be learned from the Bible, a good creed summarises the most important. A creed can quickly teach an outline of the Christian faith, in a way which can be recalled and later confirmed as trusted. At a baptism, the Apostle's Creed serves as a summary of the Christian faith. Similarly, when teaching, a creed establishes standards of doctrine, drawn from the Bible.

4. Unity

When we recite a creed together, it's a wonderful moment of unity, as we affirm what we believe are the core principles of Christian faith.


