

Jesus: light in the darkness

As the news reports rolled in from Bondi Beach last Sunday night, I was saddened and sickened to my stomach. The terror which took place at Bondi beach reveals that no place is immune to the deep problems of humanity.

In the context of war and worldwide divisions over who is the most wicked, my mind was immediately drawn to Jesus, who changes the focus back upon each of us. Just that afternoon I read with some people Jesus' own words: "For it is from within, out of a person's heart, that evil thoughts come—sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, lewdness, envy, slander, arrogance and folly. All these evils come from inside and defile a person." (Mark 7:20-21)

But Jesus did not come with a rifle or sword in order to honour God and purify the world. Rather, he died at the hands of wicked people, so that they could be saved. Jesus' self-sacrifice is light and life to a world darkened by evil and sin (John 1:4-5). Furthermore, his instruction for those who follow him, and are zealous for God, is this: "But to you who are listening I say: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you." (Luke 6:27-28)

The Bible states that authorities are to administer justice and do good for our society (Romans 13:1-7), and that we must pray for a peaceful and quiet society for all people (1 Timothy 2:1-2). At this time we are particularly to pray for the safety and consolation of our Jewish communities. Yet above all, we recognise and pray for widespread reception of the deeper peace, hope and restoration for the world, which comes through the self-giving love of God, in the Jewish man Jesus Christ. "For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all people." (1 Timothy 2:5-6)
