



Has God suddenly left us all alone?

World events throughout 2025 have continued to weigh heavily on our hearts. In the Middle East, killings have persisted despite ceasefires. Ukraine and Russia remain locked in daily conflict. Christians continue to be killed in places such as Nigeria, even amid US-backed efforts to curb rebel violence in the north. Iran and Syria sit at breaking points, while poverty and famine show little sign of easing.

In short, the misery of millions has not improved, despite the tireless work of many agencies seeking to bring relief. If you are unsure, simply read the Anglican Aid Prayer Diary.

Here in the “Lucky Country,” we have largely stood removed from many of these global crises; that is until December 14 and the events at Bondi. Terrorism and violent death moved from distant headlines to the green grass and golden sands of our own world-famous beach. Our sense of safety was profoundly shaken. The sudden death in early 2026 of someone well known to many has only deepened that sense of loss.

Last year, a Year 6 SRE student at Balarang Public School asked a thoughtful question. We were talking about lives changed through encountering Jesus, particularly Zacchaeus, perched in the sycamore tree, wanting to see Jesus but not to be confronted by Him. The student asked, *“How can I tell when God is working in my life?”*

How do you answer that in just a few words? After speaking about prayer, reading the Bible, and God’s constant presence, all I could finally say was this: *you will know when the hand of God is at work in you.*

God never leaves us alone, and He never will. When we do not understand what is happening, He always does. Romans 8:26 reminds us that when we do not know how to pray, the Holy Spirit intercedes for us before the throne of God.

So keep praying, and stay close to His Word.
