



The true and lasting happiness of joy

“Do what makes you happy.” “I just want my kids to be happy.” Our culture prizes happiness above almost everything else.

Christians, however, often speak instead about joy. Scripture is full of it. The psalmist writes, “At his sacred tent I will sacrifice with shouts of joy; I will sing and make music to the Lord” (Ps 27:6). Paul urges believers, “Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!” (Phil 4:4).

Because of this emphasis, many Christians draw a sharp line between joy and happiness. Happiness, we are told, is light and fleeting, shaped by circumstances. Joy, on the other hand, is deep, constant, and rooted in God. Paul’s words, “sorrowful, yet always rejoicing” (2 Cor 6:10), are often used to show that joy cannot be the same as happiness.

But perhaps this distinction goes too far.

Joy is *not* less than happiness. In fact, happiness is an essential part of true spiritual joy. If joy lacked any positive feeling, it would no longer be joy at all. Scripture regularly describes joy as something that makes people sing, shout, leap, and celebrate (Ps 98:4–9; Luke 6:23). At times, the Bible even uses words like gladness and happiness alongside joy.

When Paul says he is “sorrowful, yet always rejoicing,” he is not denying that joy is positive. Rather, he shows that Christians can experience deep happiness in God even while walking through real sorrow. Joy does not erase pain, but it exists alongside it.

Christian joy, then, is not shallow or fragile happiness. It is **true and lasting happiness rooted in heavenly realities**—a gladness grounded not in circumstances, possessions, or success, but in the unchanging goodness of God.

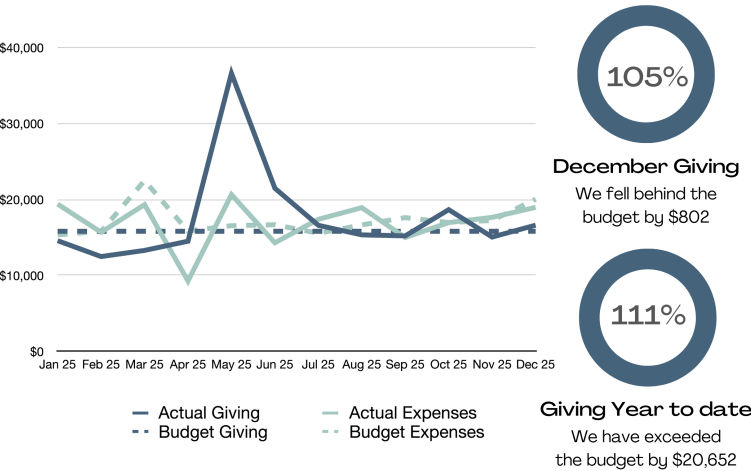
